
John 19:30 "It is finished."

Proverbs 16:9 In their hearts humans plan their course, but the LORD establishes their steps.


Matthew 4:4 Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.'

This classic hymn reminds us that our Lord has plans for our lives that we can choose to follow. Jesus knew that He had a plan given for Him to follow, which included being tested in the wilderness by the Devil. The first of the temptations is to create bread from stones. And Jesus refused, instead trusting in God rather than misusing his powers to satisfy his own needs.

Later on in the Gospels, Jesus comments that He is the bread of life, which we can follow and use to nourish our lives, which is picked up at the end of the first verse of the hymn.



Ephesians 2:8-9 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— not by works, so that no one can boast.



Beginning at the beginning with God's hidden Word, the song reveals this to be Jesus Himself and celebrates the power of His name (which means Saviour of course). It starts with Creation and takes us through Jesus' death to the silence of the grave and on to the "roaring" heavens. It's quite the tour de force!

But the line that won't leave me is, You didn't want heaven without us so Jesus You brought heaven down. The bluntness of the words are shocking - and the truth revealed is the greatest truth that can be revealed, which is also shocking. God loves us so much He wants us to spend eternity with Him and He was willing to pay any price to accomplish that. The price was the death of His Son. As a father and grandfather, words fail me to express such love....

Ephesians 6:10-20 (11 and 12 below) Put on the full armour of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.

Jerusalem is Marie's favourite and has at times been the number 1 hymn on Songs of Praise. It asks the question of whether Jesus visited England (not likely) with potential reference to the industrial revolution. As with any poem, it is important to not necessarily take it too literally but it was used as an anthem for equal rights by the suffragettes and does call us to arms with its rousing tune.

It calls to mind the passage about the armour of God in Ephesians 6. It is important to remember that we are also told by Jesus in John 13:15 that "I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you." We're called to be Jesus' hands and feet and to carry on the work that He started. Where we see injustice we need to ask God to equip us to fight it, in his strength and with his weapons of truth, grace, mercy and his word.

Isaiah 53:5 But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed.

"But I wasn't doing anything!!".... "But they were doing it!!" ... "It's not FAIR!!".... This could be the kind of reaction from a child just caught misbehaving who didn't want to face up to the consequences of their behaviour.

But it is also what Jesus could have said to us. He didn't do anything wrong, that was us who were doing the sinning! And it certainly wasn't *fair* that He took that punishment for us.

But take the punishment is what He did. And He didn't moan about it either. The crowd urged him to call down angels to save him – but He didn't. Jesus didn't do the *fair* thing – on that darkest day He did the ONLY thing that could save us.

Spend some time reflecting on the pain that your sin put Jesus through on the cross in your place – thank Him that He's taken your place to make you clean.


But the words "Because He lives I can face tomorrow" – oh yes.

Dave writes: On the morning of 18/9/2016 whilst on holiday in Gozo, Malta for some reason my attention was drawn to the front cover of my Bible on which this particular verse was printed – it really registered at the time but I didn't have a clue why. However, later that day whilst diving at around 30m/100 feet taking photographs I suffered from the bends and was rushed into hospital – I lost the use of my legs and was placed in a decompression chamber for 6 hours to counteract the problem of having too much nitrogen in my body. I felt an unusual sense of peace in the circumstances and long story short I was transferred to the main hospital in Malta where I stayed for further sessions in a decompression chamber which successfully resolved the situation – along with prayers and support from family and friends. Although sadly I can no longer dive I did discover that I had diabetes type 2, high blood pressure and high cholesterol plus I needed to lose weight. I wasn't aware of any of those other than the last one but now as a result of this experience I know about them and they are all under control. Particular words in the song that resonate in relation to this experience and others are – 'In oceans deep my faith will stand' – 'You've never failed and you won't start now' – 'My soul will rest in your embrace', 'I am Yours and You are mine', and because I can no longer

dive I love instead 'Let me walk upon the waters!'

Philippians 2:5-11 (Verse 7 below) Rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.

Sharon chose this as it summed up the whole Christmas story and is pertinent to Easter as we see in verse 3.

It is sometimes easy to take sections of the Bible that inspired the festivals of Lent, Christmas and Easter out of the bigger picture. And whilst they're all important in their own right, it is important to sometimes step back and reflect on how it all links together.

Without Jesus' miraculous birth at Christmas, there would be no Jesus to be tempted in the wilderness at Lent. Without the temptation at Lent, there would be no sinless saviour to die for us on Good Friday. Without the death on Good Friday, there's no resurrection on Easter Sunday. And without the Ascension, there's no mediator for us in Heaven, sat at the right hand of the Father.

Use the song to pause and reflect on how it all knits together so beautifully to save us.

The song talks about all the wonderful things that God does and how he turns situations around (e.g. 'who makes the orphan a son and daughter') repeatedly affirms God's absolute power in everything ('the King of glory, the King above all things') and reminds us of the ultimate sacrifice and gift that God has given us ('this is amazing love, that you would take my place,' 'You laid down your life that I would be set free').

"Aside from the happy memories attached to it, this song is a declaration of the wonder of God and a beautiful reminder that God is bigger than any problem I have."





Psalm 23:4 Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

This is a song that is probably one of the most known by non-church goers in our hymnbooks because of its use on Remembrance and at the FA Cup. But it struck me that in Lent, when Jesus was fasting in the wilderness, in an earthly sense He was on his own. And when Jesus was on the cross He famously called out "My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?" showing how again Jesus knew what it was like to be alone.

When we call out to God when we're on our own, Jesus is there interceding for us, because He knows what it is like.

I think Jesus got used to being uncomfortable. He was born in a stable, a refugee in Egypt, didn't seem to have a permanent 'home' on Earth from his travelling around, was harassed by the religious leaders.... The list goes on.

At Lent we focus on him depriving himself of his earthly needs for 40 days and then the temptation that arrived. And after Lent, in our calendar (even though not in Jesus lifeline) we have Easter where he suffered pain that we can not even begin to understand.

But as verse 4 reminds us, without Jesus overcoming the temptation at Lent, he wouldn't have been good enough to save us. Only Jesus was capable of saving us from our sin.

Is there something that you can abstain from today, and instead spend that time focusing on God and relying on his strength to help you through?
