If you have phone calls included in your bill, then these numbers shouldn't cost you to join the meeting, but please check.





# Isolation - Tim

These are strange times that we're living in, with having to shelter in our houses from an invisible threat, that no one can apparently do anything about. So how can we respond to it?

Isaiah 41:10 (see below) is a verse that I think should bring us some comfort over the challenging weeks (and months?) ahead whilst we navigate the coronavirus as a country and world.

We are not facing this virus alone. We need to be constantly praying to God to ask Him to protect those we know, but also those we don't. We were reminded in the prayer meeting the other night that we are relatively fortunate here as we've generally got houses and clean water, whereas in some countries that the virus hasn't quite got to yet, they haven't got those essentials. So we need to ensure that we're also praying for people elsewhere who may be struggling even more than we are. We can spend the 'extra time' we have to spend more time reading the Bible and getting to know it better.

But we're also part of a church family. We are trying to remain connected by sharing in regular 'meetings' through the week where we can join around God's word, but also talk to each other about what is going on in our lives and the different things that we're doing each day to keep the boredom away!
