Trustee's Thoughts

Could you love a bin man?

I mean what's not to love about Dusty? His luscious hair, his eye catching clothing, his muscular physique... maybe not... I mean he must STINK! And he's maybe eaten a pork pie or two too many! But the question still stands, could you love a bin man? Not in that way! I'm not after whether you'd marry him - no - would you love him? What if Dusty turned up to church (without the safety of a smell reducing video link) - would you let him sit next to you? In my Bible reading app I'm looking at James (the book rather than my son) and have got to chapter 2 where James poses a similar question. He questions how we'd treat a rich man and a poor man, and goes on later in the chapter to show how our behaviours expose the 'quality' of our faith. And in verse 8, James looks at the 'Royal Law found in Scripture, "Love your neighbour as yourself".' Linking how we've treated the different people to this and that if we fall down at this, it's as though we're not following God's and Jesus' instructions at all.

We have looked at the importance of obedience in my recent service from the letters to the churches in Revelation and James' book carries some elements of that through it. James in chapter 2 verse 17 says in the Voice "Without actions, faith is useless. By itself, it's as good as dead." James asserts that our behaviours, decisions and actions are showing the 'quality' of our faith - is it alive or dead? And that comes down to how we treat God and those He puts in our paths.

Do you love God? Do you love Jesus? Do you love the Holy Spirit?

When Simon Peter was asked by Jesus three times whether he loved Him in John 21, each time Peter responded, he was instructed to 'Feed my lambs', 'Take care of my sheep', and to 'Feed my sheep'. Our response to loving God, should be to love our neighbours and to take care of those who God puts in our paths.

We have many opportunities to help our 'neighbours', whether financially like for those at the Annabel School with their need for a water pump or with the local food bank and other local community appeals we'll be having over the next few months. Or maybe through volunteering your time with meetings like DCF or organisations like the Uniform Bank which is celebrating this weekend giving out over 20,000 items since they opened in 2019.

Or maybe, it is just sitting next to that metaphorical binman, that person who others ignore. Showing them God's love through your faith, your actions.
